

They are reading texts in Hungarian and in the original languages from authors who cannot be present at the festival in person, because of the border closures. The performance includes texts from the children's book by Csirimojó Publishing House ,How do Animals Sleep?' (Hogyan alszanak az állatok?) by Marie Štumpfová and Jiří Dvořák set to music, and interactive installations by MOME University of Art and Design students.

The event is about the volume Hogyne szeretnélek! published at Tilos az Á publishing house, containing Shakespeare sonnets retranslated by Péter Papolczy. Its members are popular figures of the Hungarian music scene: Sena Dagadu (Irie Maffia), Márkos Albert, Gryllus Samu és G. Szabó Hunor. Their name is a reference to the muse of the Shakespeare sonnets: a certain mysterious Mr. W. H. Reading from Péter Papolczy's Hogyne szeretnélek! : Henrietta Szalay, György Molnár.
